 How are sustainability courses offered across UW and how to improve sustainability education?




Figure 1: Three Dimensions of Sustainability

Internship and Methods




- I served as an intern for UW Sustainability. Went through the descriptions of all courses and marked sustainability verifications with my groupmate.




Figure 3: Data visualization showing a comparison of sustainability course numbers in different majors

 - Unevenly distributed sustainability courses in different programs (Figure 3).



Results (continued)
